

RusHydro completes construction of the 193 MW Yakutskaya GRES-2 in the Far East

November 1, 2017. Moscow, Russia. PJSC RusHydro (MOEX, LSE: HYDR; OTCQX: RSHYY) announces that construction of the first stage of gas-fired Yakutskaya GRES-2 is now complete. The facility's key equipment has undergone comprehensive testing; the plant was cleared to start commercial operation.

Currently, Yakutskaya GRES-2 is in operation and supplies electricity to the central power system of Yakutiya (Sakha), and heat to consumers of Yakutsk.

Yakutskaya GRES-2 (2st stage) is one of four priority projects in the Far East of Russia implemented in accordance with the Decree of the President of Russia. Facility's electric capacity is 193 MW, heat generation capacity – 469 GCal/h (including boiler). The new unit should substitute capacity of the retiring Yakutskaya GRES, create capacity reserve and increase reliability of supply.

RusHydro Group is one of Russia's largest generating companies. RusHydro is the leading producer of renewable energy in Russia with over 70 generating facilities in Russia and abroad. The company also manages a number of R&D, engineering and electricity retail companies. Group's thermal assets are operated by subsidiary – RAO Energy System of East in the Far East of Russia. Total electricity generation capacity of the Group is 38.7 GW, heat capacity – 16.2 thousand GCal/h.

Russian Federation owns 66.8% in RusHydro, the rest is held by other institutional and individual shareholders (over 360,000). The company's stock is traded on Moscow Exchange (MOEX), and included in MSCI EM и MSCI Russia indexes. Company's GDRs in the IOB section of LSE, ADRs – in OTCQX.

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
